HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT:

The Highway Commissioner reported that they have been very busy with Brush pickup from the storm, they also have contracted with Kosak Tree Service. They will be going through the Township and have the information on the website.

He mentioned that their chippers are starting to break down. The oldest one is from 1993 the other one is from 1998. The problem is finding parts for them when they break down. These are very expensive machines, so they will try to patch them up as best they can. If they absolutely must replace one, it would be with a used model.

There is a lot of overgrown brush on Swift Road, north of Lake Street. The west side against the golf course. It is a dangerous area to cut, they have arranged for Kramer Trees to cut the brush.

On Sycamore, in North Medinah, on the west side, there is a private dead-end street that has three houses on it. One house had a very large brick mailbox that was five feet wide and five feet high. Recently a car hit the mailbox, the homeowner called DuPage County to see if anyone would repair it. The township does not repair brick mailboxes, they are illegal in our township. While the Highway Commissioner was out there looking, he noticed a creek right behind this mailbox. He found out that IDOT has to do a traffic study. They are requesting incident reports from the Sherriff for the past five years. He thought that a guard rail should be installed, then we should keep all of this information together in case there is an accident.

The Highway Commissioner said that they have a storm water permit with Illinois EPA and DuPage County, so they attended a mandatory Storm Water Management Seminar on Green Infrastructure. It was about how important trees are to our lives. The trees slow down erosion, the canopy of the trees slows the water coming down to the ground. It processes all of the impurities out of the air. He also mentioned a 50-50 tree program, similar to what a lot of the villages are doing. He requested further information on this, but there would have to be guide lines. If we were to plant a tree and the homeowner does not water it, then they could call and complain that it died and have us come back to remove it. A lot of ash trees have been taken down and the people have missed them. If they want to replace the tree there is discount that can be offered to them at no cost to the township.

That completed his report.

Supervisor Hovde thanked the Highway Commissioner for his report.
